1	Language For Effect: Vocabulary Development Blue A/B	With prompting, often show understanding of a range of familiar and less familiar words and phrases.	Showing off	1	Riding fast; lying	Try re-reading the sentence, using the other words instead of 'boasting'. Which fits the meaning best?
2	Inference: Making Inferences Blue A/B	Link events in a book, in order to answer questions about why or how events take place.	Jake's bike is new, but Tom's bike is rusty.	1	Jake has broken Tom's bike. Jake knows that Tom does not want to race.	Look at the first page again, and think about the differences between Jake's bike and Tom's bike.
3	Literal Comprehension: Literal Comprehension Blue A/B	Identify and link two significant events in a story they have listened to or read.	Jake will make fun of him.	1	Jake will race someone else. Jake's bike will get broken.	Re-read the page. What does Tom think will happen if he says no?
4	Literal Comprehension: Literal Comprehension Blue A/B	Identify and link two significant events in a story they have listened to or read.	He falls off/fell off.	1	Any incorrect answer	Re-read the page. What happens when Jake does a wheelie to show off?
5	Inference: Prediction Blue A/B	Explain a prediction about what might happen next in a book based on personal opinions and experience.	Tom, because Jake has fallen off his bike	1	Jake, because he can do wheelies Nobody, because both bikes are broken	Jake's bike is fast, but think about what has just happened – will this slow him down?  This is not what the text says. Re-read the story and look for clues about what might happen.
