To all to whom these presents shall come We the Reverend John Haygarth Rector of Uplham in the County of Southampton Walter Long of Proctor's House in the said County of Southampton Esquire William Ross of Belvoir in the

(10) same County Esquire and the Right Reverend Father in God Charles Richard Esq Bishop of Winchester send greeting Whereat at a Special Court Baron Holden for the Manor of Bishops Cleeve in the said County of Southampton on or about the seventeenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty the Copyhold Credits hereby released and conveyed were a Surrender by James Stoppins Attorney to the use of the said John Haygarth the Reverend George Chandler Clerk and the said Walter Long and William Ross and their heirs according to the custom of the said manor and whereat at the same Court the said John Haygarth George Chandler Walter Long and William Ross were admitted to the said Copyhold Credits to hold to them and their heirs according to the custom of the said manor and whereat by a certain Decree poll under the hands and Seals of the said John Haygarth George Chandler Walter Long and William Ross and bearing date on or about the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty and enrolled in Her Majesty's High Court of Chancery on the fourteenth day of August last it was declared and agreed that they the said John Haygarth George Chandler Walter Long and William Ross and the survivors and survivor of them and their heirs should stand and be seized and possessed of the said Copyhold Credits so surrendered to them and hereby released and conveyed upon trust for or to the use of the managers for the time being of the School at Uplham which it was by the Decree poll was in vital declared should always be applied to the Diocesan Society for promoting the education of the poor in the principles of the Established Church

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
and should be conducted in conformity with the principles of that institution and towards the advancement of its ends and objects and upon and for no other use, trust, intent or purpose whatsoever and whereas the said George Chandler departed this life in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty six leaving the said Joan Staggart Walter Long and William Ross his Co Trustees and in whom the legal estate of and in the said Copyhold credits is now vested and surviving and whereas the said Joan Staggart Walter Long and William Ross have in pursuance of the power to them for that purpose given in and by the act of Parliament herein after mentioned or refers to proposed and resolved to execute the Release and Conveyance herein after mentioned for the purpose of vesting the legal estate of and in the said Copyhold credits in the Minister and Commissioners for the time being of the said Manor of Altham in manner herein after mentioned and whereas the said Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester being in right of his See Lord of the said Manor of Bishops Waltham hath in pursuance of the power to him for that purpose given in and by the same act of Parliament also proposed and resolved to execute the Release and Conveyance herein after mentioned in order that the Copyhold credits hereby released and conveyed may hereafter be enfranchised and be for ever hereafter freed and exonerated from the payment of all such Rents Chief Rents customary or Copyhold Rents Services and Ariots and from the performance of all fealty and Suit of Court and all Copyhold or Customary Services whatsoever which by the custom prescription or otherwise howsoever are liable to be paid rendered or performed to the Lord of the said Manor of Bishops Waltham for the time being in respect of the said credits Now therefore these presents witness that in pursuance of such proposals and under the authority of an act of Parliament passed in the fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled an Act for affording further facilities for the conveyance and enjoyment of sites for schools and of all and every

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other powers or authorities power or authority in any writ enabling them in this behalf they the said Joan Staggarta Walter Long and William Ross and the said Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester have and care and every of them State release and recovery and by these presents do and care and every of them State release and recovery unto the Minister and Courtenardens of the Parish of Alpaam aforesaid all that a Milling tenements into and with as a school together with the site thereof bounded on the North by the Queen's Highway on the South and East by lands belonging to the said Joan Staggarta and on the West by lands now or late of William Brundy late parcel of one messuage and half a parting of Bond & Land called Brookham and Garden and one Croft containing half an acre called Arut are in the County of Alpaam) and all their and care of their Estate right title and interest in or to the said credits to wold the same unto and to the said Minister and Courtenardens for the time being of the said Parish of Alpaam and their Successors Alpoze sure and the same Covenants and to and for sure and the same ends intents and purposes contained in the said writ before recited Decr 20th of the Twentieth year of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty as are now existing and capable of taking effect In witness whereof they the said Joan Staggarta Walter Long William Ross and Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester have agreed set their hands and seals the Twentieth fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven

the Statutes made for that purpose

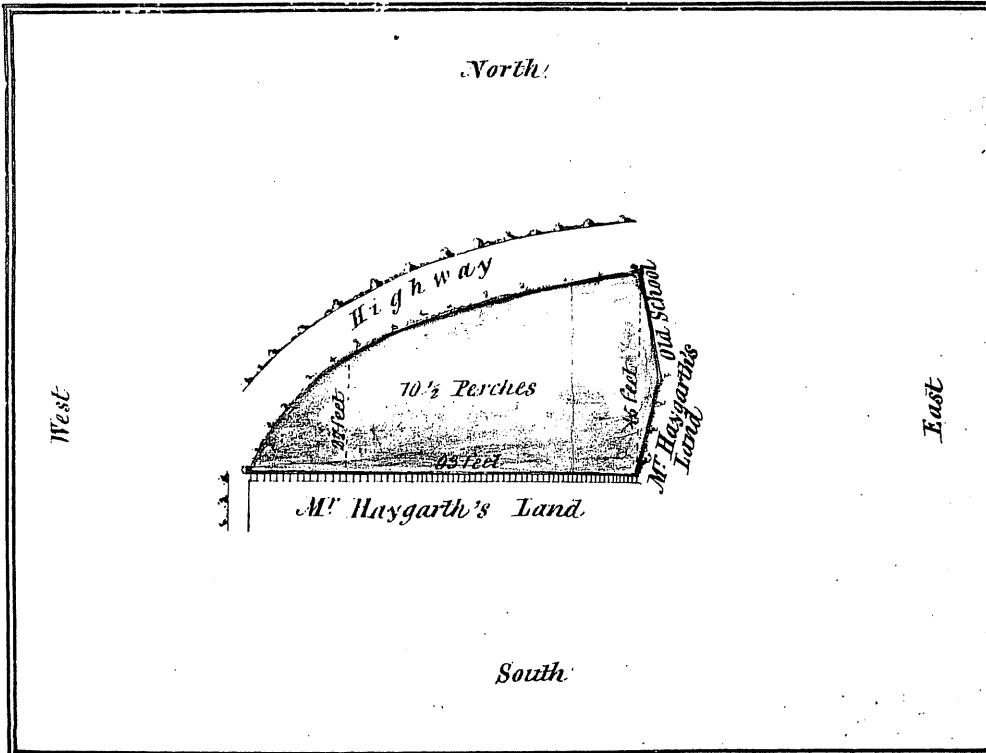

Richard by virtue of a power
and Bishop of Winchester (being in right of my
the Lord of the manor of Bishops Waltham in
the County of Southampton of waste manor the
part of land intended to be conveyed
and part and parcel and to the intent
that the same part of land may hereafter
be enfranchised and be for ever hereafter free and
incorporated from the payment of all such rents
and duties customary or copyhold rents fees and
services and from the performance of all fealty
and of Court and all copyhold or customary
services whatsoever which by custom prescription or
otherwise are liable to be paid rendered
or performed to the Lord of the said manor
of Bishops Waltham for the time being in respect
of the said part of land intended to be conveyed
(to be conveyed) do hereby fully and voluntarily and
without any valuable consideration grant convey
and enfranchise unto the Minister and Churchwardens
of the said parish of Uppham all that small
plot or piece of land situate and being at
Uppham in the said County of Southampton
containing by admeasurement ten and a half perches
and bounded on the north and west by the
River Stigaway on the south by land belonging
to the said John Stygart and on the east by
the land belonging to the said John Stygart

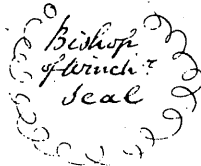
