Letters and Sounds lessons started on Monday and we have learnt four letter sounds this week: s a t p. When we learn a new sound, we also learn a cued articulation hand signal to accompany it. Cued articulation is a set of hand cues for teaching the individual sounds in a word. Each week, I will send home a sheet containing some letter writing practise of the letters we have learned that week, and on the reverse is the action which accompanies it and an explanation of how it is produced. Ask your child to show you how to do each action. I will explain and demonstrate all of this at the phonics meeting on the 9th October at 9.15 am - it is all very straight forward and helpful to so many of the children on their reading journey. There is no need to send the sheets back, they are for you to keep and to refer to. I've also enclosed a sheet of the sounds we will be learning this half term.
