As a parent/carer(s) I will:

- Ensure my child arrives at school punctually every day.
- If my child is absent I will contact the school on the first morning at the earliest opportunity ideally before 10AM.
- Inform the school at the earliest opportunity of absence due to medical appointments.
- Ensure my child looks tidy and well presented, appropriate for classroom learning in appropriate school uniform (stud ear-rings only;no makeup, no nail varnish)
- I will ensure all personal property is clearly labelled including school uniform.
- Support my child with home learning and reading

- Share any concerns about my child's learning or wellbeing with the relevant staff and discuss the best way forward.
- Attend parent teacher meetings to discuss my child's progress and well-being
- Encourage my child to embrace healthy lifestyles and support the school through providing fruit /vegetable snacks (KS2) and health lunches.

- Ensure I keep up to date with events by reading correspondence, especially the weekly newsletter.
- Ensure school is aware of any access requirements (and any changes) to enable all parents / carers to access school communications, support learning.and events .

- Encourage my child to always do their best.
- Encourage my child to get involved with school activities both inside and outside the classroom.

As a school, we will:

- Offer a brief overview of what children will be learning through half termly updates from each class.
- Contact parents if a child's punctuality or attendance becomes a concern.
- Work as a team to recognise and support children that may have specific emotional, physical, behavioural or social needs.
- Communicate the results of all statutory assessments, in accordance with DfE requirements.

- Provide an opportunity for families to meet their child's new teacher in September.
- Inform parents of their child's progress and wellbeing termly through parents evenings or written reports.

- Communicate frequently with parents through a weekly newsletter with key information about school life
- Ensure plenty of notice is given for events in/out of school that parents/carers can attend.

- Deliver a broad and balanced curriculum, going beyond the requirements of the National Curriculum to engage and enthuse children as much as possible.
