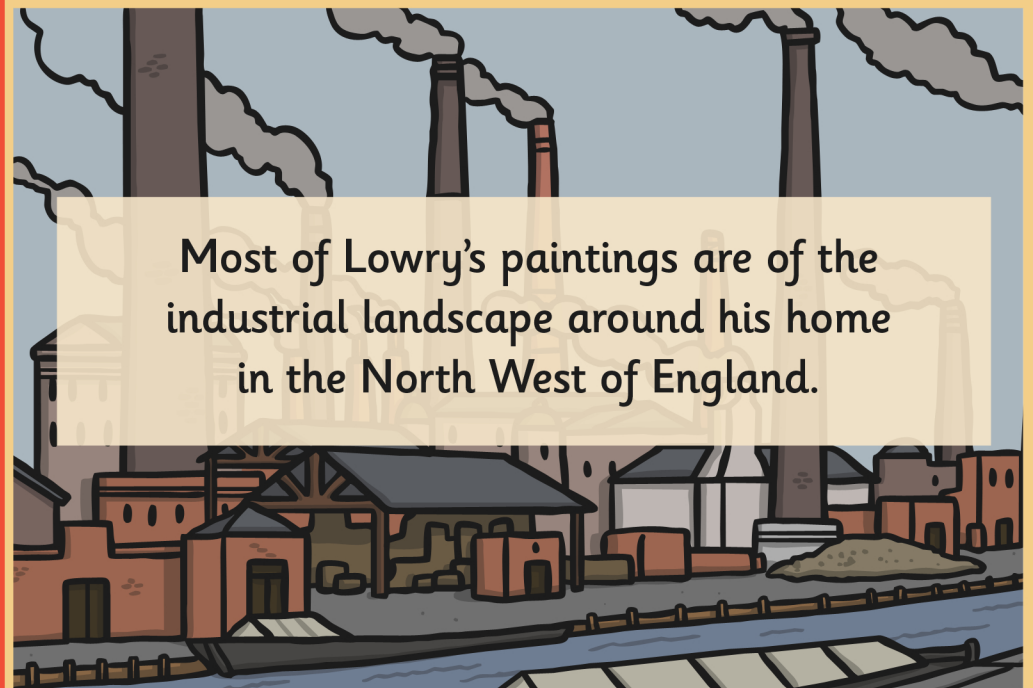
Laurence Stephen Lowry was born on November 1st 1887 in Stretford, Lancashire. He died of pneumonia on February 23rd 1976 when he was 88.



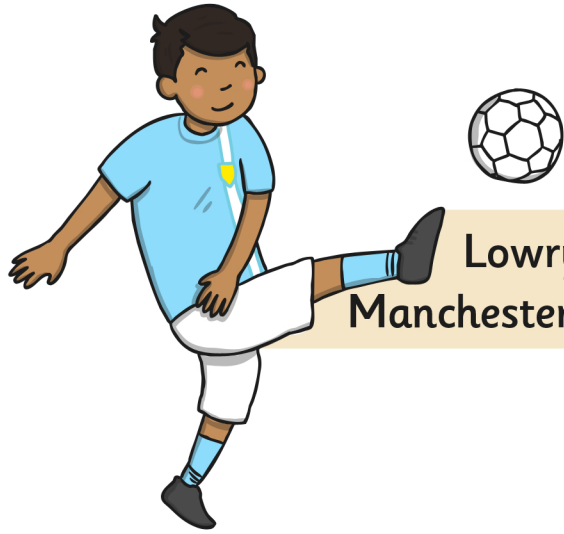
Lowry lived and worked in places around the North West of England, including Pendlebury, Salford and Mottram.

Lowry loved the seaside and he painted many paintings of the sea.

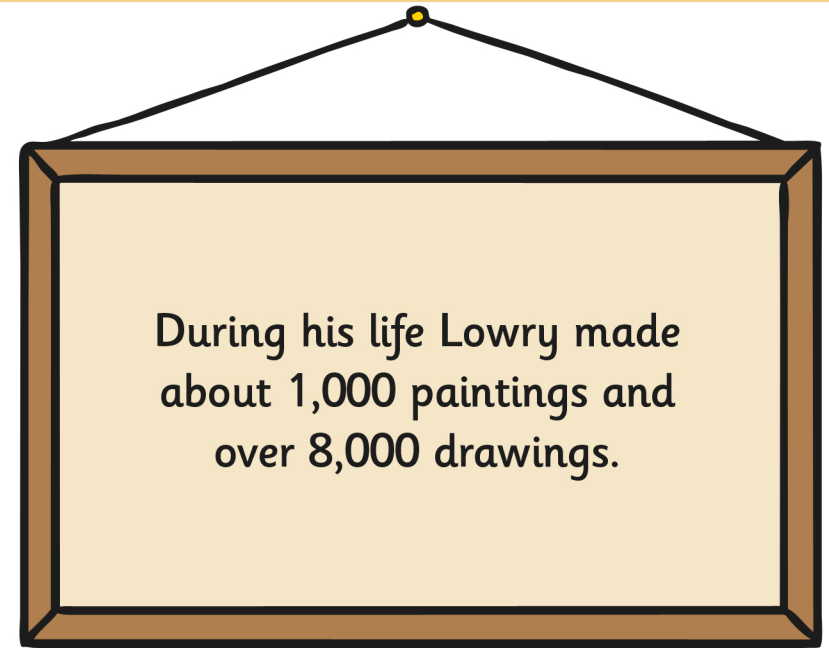


Most of Lowry's paintings are of the industrial landscape around his home in the North West of England.



Lowry was a huge fan of Manchester City Football Club.

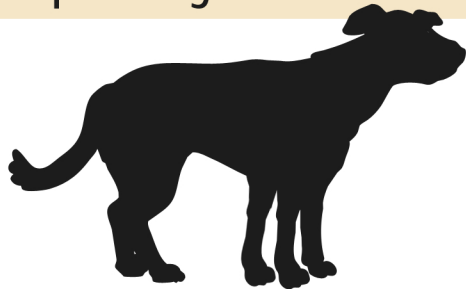

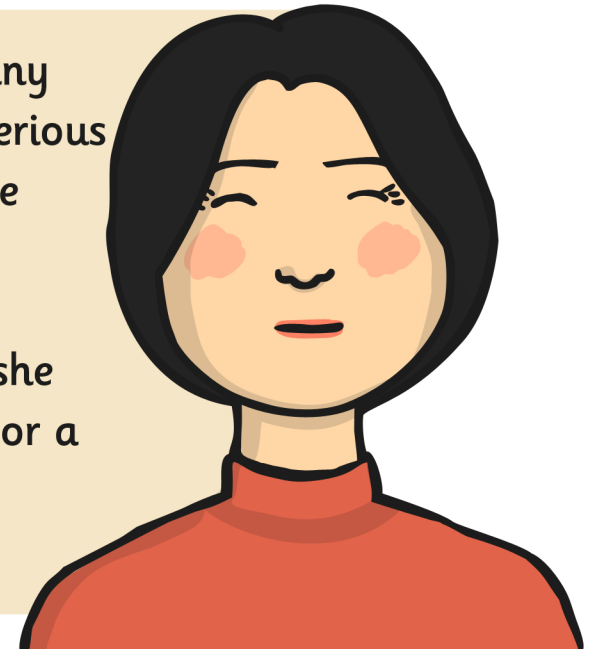
