

Adding -s and -es

Remember

You add **-s** to the end of a word to show there is more than one of something. This makes a **plural**. 'Plural' means more than one.

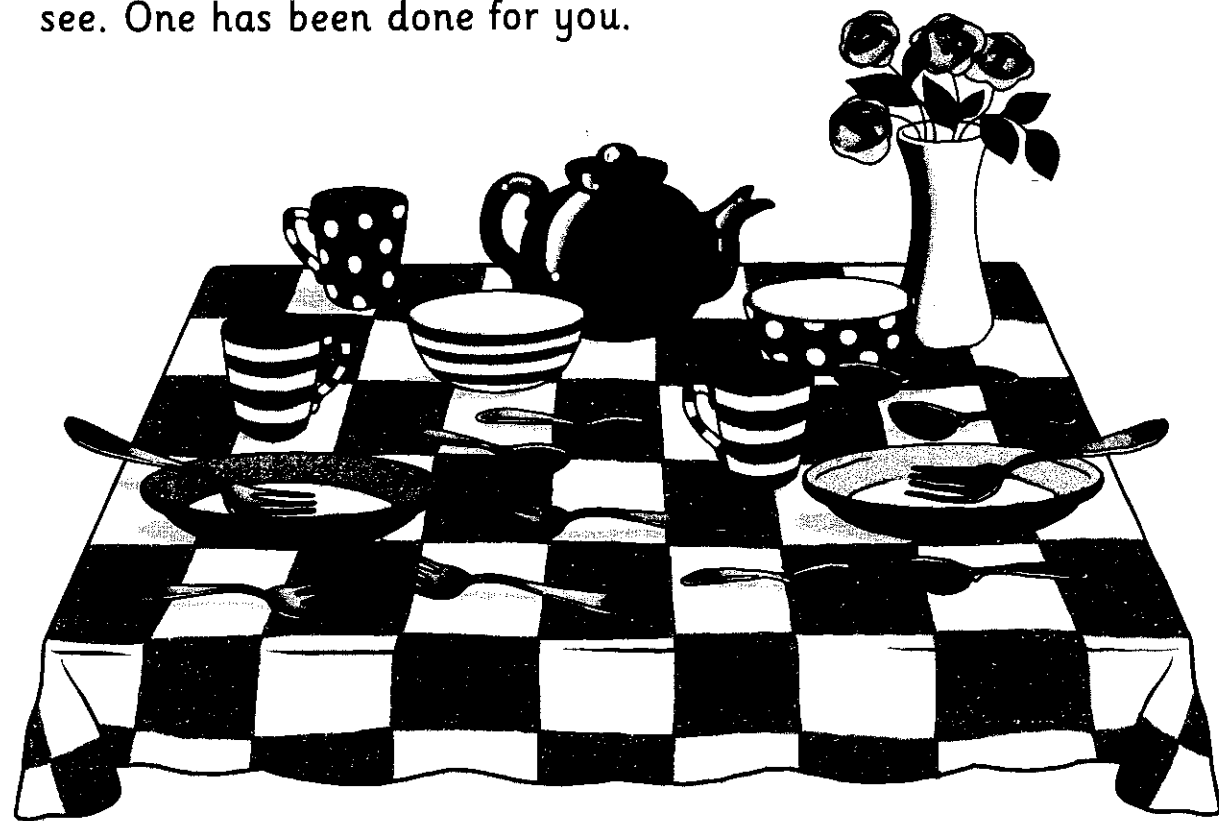
one dog (singular) two dogs (plural)

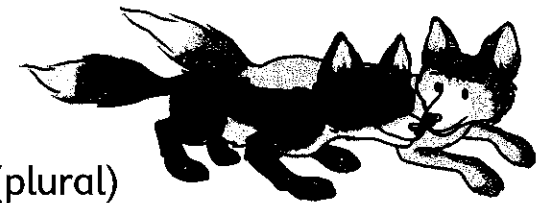
